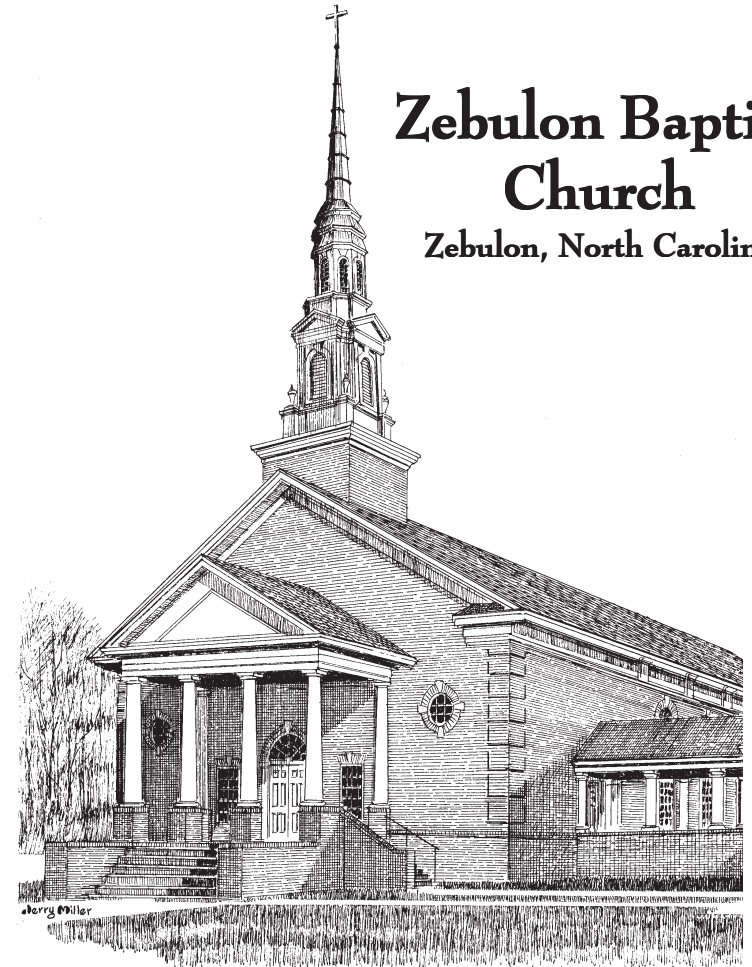

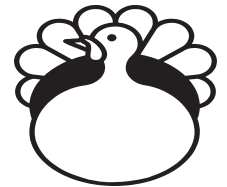

### Was This Your Shoebox?

During the first distribution of Operation Christmas Child boxes in the village of Hardbargain in Trinidad, eight-year old Felisha Hong Ping received a box and read the enclosed gospel storybook. Felisha accepted Christ and today, in 2011, Felisha and her family are helping build the first church in the village.

Felisha still remembers what she found in her shoebox that day – a doll, stationary, colorful socks, and a teddy bear. “I wanted to know who sent it and why. I didn’t know anything about Jesus, so I was really curious and started to ask questions.”

Felisha began going to church in a nearby village. The next year that there was a shoebox distribution near her home, she asked her father Phillip to bring her little sister. Phillip said, “I was amazed at the love I saw in those boxes, and because of that, I started going to church.” More families accepted Christ as shoebox gifts were passed out in Hardbargain, so pastor Daniel Kumar decided to plant a church there. Felisha’s father works in construction and offered to help lay the foundation. His entire family has been involved in the church plant, building, painting, and inviting people to come.

When asked what she would say to the person who packed her shoebox, Felisha replied, “I would say thank you very much, because it made me learn about God, it helped start this church, and it has changed my life.”

Was this your box that changed Felisha’s life?

Can you send a shoebox gift this year that will change a child’s life? And her family’s life? And the life of an entire village?
